# North Wokingham Distributor Road

In 2014 Wokingham Borough Council (WBC) selected option B as the Preferred Route for the North Wokingham Distributor Road which is needed to facilitate the additional traffic from the 1500 new houses being built in North Wokingham. Since then WBC has conducted more detailed planning and in September submitted a revised route taking into account ecological and environmental concerns to WBC Executive for approval. This was approved on 24th September 2015. The main changes are around the Toutley Road area of the route. Now that the revised route has been approved WBC planners will now commence detailed discussions with the affected landowners and Network Rail to submit a final costed option for approval by the WBC Executive next summer. The detailed discussions will also include the future location of Winnersh allotments with Winnersh Parish Council. The current plan has an area allocated off the new distributor road, however, this is not convenient for many of the allotment holders and Winnersh Parish Council has submitted four alternative sites that are more convenient to the centre of the village. It is currently forecast that the new distributor road could be open in 2019/2020 with the allotments not moving for at least two years.

# Reading Road Cycle Way

Phase 2 of the Cycle way from the Showcase Roundabout to Winnersh Crossroads was finally completed in September with the switching on of the two Toucan crossings replacing the temporary traffic lights. Phase 3 of the Cycle Way from Winnersh crossroads to Woosehill is now in the planning and consultation stage and work is expected to start next year.

#### Winnersh Fete

The 8th annual Winnersh Summer Fete took place on Saturday 20th June 2015 at Bearwood Rec, Sindlesham. The weather was not at its best but the fete was very well attended and there was a record number of stalls. Those attending were entertained by a variety of performers. There was a pianist in the bar, a jazz band playing outside and in the arena there was a full agenda of entertainment with local dance groups and with the Hurst Morris People taking the headline slots with an interesting and energetic selection of local dances. The afternoon in the arena was closed with the dog agility display which every year delights the audience with their control and enthusiastic manoeuvring round the obstacle course. Children and young people were well catered for with a bouncy castle and obstacle course and the Climbing Wall along with Circus World.

The fete raised a record amount for this year's chosen charities, Dementia UK and Guide Dogs. Thanks to all our sponsors and the local businesses who gave prizes for the raffle and particularly to Porsche who donated a Porsche Experience and Bearwood Lakes Golf Cub who donated a round of golf for four people.

He continued "We are very pleased to give this donation to such a deserving cause, especially as Guide Dogs now have a base in Winnersh on the Winnersh Triangle Business Park."

The car park has spaces for 400 vehicles for bus and rail travellers. Parking is included in the new bus fare but bus pass users will need to buy a £1 ticket on the bus.
