## Be Prepared! Floods do happen in Winnersh

Parts of Winnersh near to the River Loddon or the Emmbrook are at risk of flooding from these water courses which has happened on a number of occasions in the past. In addition, exceptionally heavy downpours can swamp the drains and the surface water runs off and collects in unexpected areas or floods homes.

A significant number of properties across Winnersh are in or near areas where there are risks of flooding from surface water. So even if you are nowhere near to the Loddon, Emm or any stream, it is well worth checking the surface water flooding risk in the area around your home.

To help you, the Environment Agency has a new free service giving on-line information about the long term flood risk assessments which affect individual properties.

Visit <a href="https://www.gov.uk/check-flood-risk">https://www.gov.uk/check-flood-risk</a> and click on 'flood maps'. The website includes maps, which can 'zoom' into individual homes, and show the assessed risks from river or surface water flooding.


The website also gives a wealth of useful information about making your own action plan of what to do if your home is threatened by flooding.

There was a variety of bikes from the mighty Harley Davidsons to the more humble Vespas. Each biker and their passengers were dressed in colourful outfits, Father Christmas, Elves, Fairies (and that was the guys!!) etc and decked with tinsel and even fairy lights. Each biker carried a toy to be distributed by Barnardo's to needy children in the area.







## Winnersh Firsts and Lasts



One of two new electric car chargers in Winnersh Triangle Park and Ride. These 'rapid chargers' will charge any electric car to 80% within 30 minutes, after which the machine turns off and the car must be removed. Cost 36p per KWh.

This is now the last working telephone box in Winnersh, which is sited in Baslow Road RG41 5QX. All other telephone boxes in Winnersh were scarcely used and, after consultation by BT, have been closed.

Said to be the first completed home (at 1 Duffett Drive) in the new Hatchwood Mill estate on the Hatch Farm Dairy Development in Winnersh.

## Local News

## New Premier Inn at Oakdene Court

Whitbread Plc have submitted outline proposals to Wokingham Borough Council for the development of a 102 bedroom Premier Inn hotel together with a Beefeater restaurant and a drive-thru Costa Coffee and associated car parking at Oakdene Court (Vernalis) on the site of the old Merrell Dow Research Institute on the North East side of the Showcase roundabout in Winnersh. Since the old occupants moved out in 2012 the site has been vacant.

Whitbread's proposal positions the four storey building to the north east of the site to help alleviate the risk of flooding and to reduce the impact on nearby residents.. The integral hotel, restaurant/bar and Costa will take up a smaller footprint than the current buildings they will replace. The entrance, restaurant and Costa will occupy the ground floor and the bedrooms of the Premier Inn will occupy the other three floors.

The entrance/exit will remain in the current position on the Reading Road. There will be a new footpath built on the West side of the development to encourage customers to walk to the development from Winnersh Triangle Business Park.

It is proposed that the current trees and shrubs along the boundaries of the site be retained together with a landscaped patio in front of the restaurant to minimise the visual impact of the new development. Subject to planning permission it is expected that development will start in early 2018 and the hotel, restaurant and Costa

drive-thru opening in early 2019.









# Phase 4 of the Cycleway

Work commenced on 20th March 2017 on Phase 4 of the Cycleway and lasting approximately twenty weeks and which eventually is intended to stretch from Reading to Ascot along the route of the A329. Phase 1 was from the Three Tuns Crossroads in Earley to Loddon Bridge. Phase 2 continues to the Winnersh Crossroads and Phase 3 runs from Winnersh Crossroads to Woodward Close just before the M4 motorway bridge. The 1.5 kilometre Phase 4 commences at Landen Grove just past The Old Forest Road junction through the Woosehill Roundabout and will finish at Holt Lane. The stretch between Woodward Close and Landen Grove will be developed once the new roundabouts connecting the North Wokingham Distributor Road and the Winnersh Relief Road have been completed, currently scheduled for 2021. Work on Phase 4 will include the installation of new kerbs and the relaying of large sections of the footpath as well as the relaying of the road surface similar to Phases 1 to 3. The pedestrian islands and traffic lights do not need to be replaced reducing the impact on road users.

Phases 1 to 3 were developed and paid for under the governments Sustainable Transport Fund. Phases 4 and 5 will be developed under the £4.2m Local Economic Partnership.

## Winnersh Relief Road

The new Winnersh Relief road will be constructed in two major steps. Part 1 of the Relief Road will be built by Bovis and it will be between King Street Lane and Lower Earley Way. The King Street Lane junction was subcontracted by Bovis and is being build by Hope and Clay. The work started on 7th April and it is scheduled to be finished in 17 weeks from then. The second intersection (Lower Earley Way) is being built by a Persimmon subcontractor, work will commence after completion of King Street Lane intersection. WBC has no plans to open the first part of the Relief Road as a through road before the second part of the Relief Road to the Reading Road is completed.

The Second part of the Relief Road (from the end of Longdon Road to the Reading Road) will be built by WBC. At this time it is scheduled to be opened in 2021. It may be opened a little earlier than that. The Second part of the Relief Road will include a roundabout on the Reading Road. At this point WBC owns the land that the road will be built on and has a grant to build the road. A planning application will be submitted for these works sometime either late Spring or the Summer of 2017.

WBC has decided to put the roundabout for the North Wokingham Distributor Road into this project as well to decrease the disruption to residents. This will be built in the present location of the allotments and behind the BP station. In addition Reading Road will be lowered under the M4 overpass as part of this project and the Reading Road will be closed while the lowering of the road takes place.

Traffic signals will be installed on King Street Lane and Lower Earley Way intersections but WBC has no plans, at this time, to turn the signals on until the Relief Road is fully open.

The two roundabouts on the Reading Road are not planned to have any signals and operate as a roundabout. The last part indirectly attached to this project is construction of a left turn lane ( for up to 4 cars) on Old Forest Road and the Reading Road. The planned traffic signals at this intersection will not be built, even though this was a condition on the Matthews Green Planning application according to WBC Highways, because of the additional cost and complexity of unmapped utilities under the junction.

## Litter Pick 2017

On a bright and sunny Sunday morning on 2<sup>nd</sup> April thirty volunteers gathered in the carpark of St Marys Church to take part in the annual WBC Litter Pick. Organised locally by Winnersh Parish Council the volunteers were provided with high viz vests, litter pickers and two plastic bags, one for general waste and one for recyclable waste such as plastic and glass bottles and metal cans. After a briefing the volunteers set off on their allocated routes along the main streets in Winnersh. They returned later with forty bags of rubbish that were collected later by WBC.

Our thanks to St Marys Church for the use of their carpark and the ladies of St Marys for providing the refreshments, much appreciated.
