Minutes of the **FINANCE & GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE** meeting held remotely on **Tuesday 26 January 2021**.

PRESENT: Cllrs J. Southgate (Chairman); L. Wooldridge; P Bray; P. Fishwick; G. Harper; R. Shepherd-DuBey (late arrival);

IN ATTENDANCE: P Stoneman (Parish Clerk); Kate Lang (Assistant Parish Clerk).

- 1 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE None
- 2 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST -** Cllr Fishwick declared an interest in Item 6 Setting the Chairman's allowance 2021/22 and left the meeting for that item.

3 MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 26 OCTOBER 2020

- 3.1 (Item 3.2) Several allotment holder deposits had been repaid. The CELO was in the process of seeking banking details for the remainder, and these would also be repaid.
- 3.2 (Item 4.3) A UNITY Corporate MultiPay Card had been applied for.
- 3.3 (Item 4.4) The annual CIL reports had all been uploaded to the new WPC website.
- 3.4 (Item 5.3) The donation of £500 to WADE was now shown in the correct expenditure code.
- 3.5 (Item 7.5) It was agreed that Policies would be reviewed at the next meeting.

4 PUBLIC SESSION - There were no members of the public or press in attendance.

5 DONATIONS AND REFERRALS

5.1 Two applications had been received and the committee awarded the following grants:-

- 1) Keep Mobile £1,000 grant awarded.
- 2) St Catherine's Church 175th Anniversary Appeal £50 grant awarded.

- 5.3 The total allocation for general grants in 2020/21 was £1,950.
- 5.4 The total allocation for community transport grants in 2020/21 was £1,000.
- 5.5 There were no referrals from Committee's.

6 CHAIRMAN'S ALLOWANCE 2021/22

6.1 The committee considered the Chairman's annual allowance and, at the **PROPOSAL** of Cllr Southgate, **SECONDED** by Cllr Harper, it was **RESOLVED** to leave the allowance at the current level of $\pounds 160$ ($\pounds 40$ /quarter) for 2021/22.

7 UTILITIES (GAS AND ELECTRIC)

- 7.1 The Clerk informed the committee of the on-going issues relating to the electric and gas meters that fed the community centre and parish office.
- 7.2 Invoices relating to the gas supply showed a meter (G4K1016371101) that no longer existed and that was recording units in metric (cubic metres). The meter in use (8010793S) that should be used for recording gas used was recording units in imperial (cubic feet). The Clerk had raised these matters with NPower who provided energy to WPC up to October 2020 and Gulf Energy that was the newly contracted energy supplier from October 2020.
- 7.3 As a consequence, it was believed that WPC had been overcharged for energy and the Clerk was in the process of establishing what that amounted to and to recover the overpayment.
- 7.4 The committee agreed that as this matter had not been resolved in a timely way that the Clerk should make contact with the Chief Executive of Npower and, if necessary, Ofgem.
- 7.5 The Clerk advised that he expected Gulf Energy to respond more quickly given that WPC is a new customer.

7.6 The Clerk advised that a SMART meter (replacing electric meter S81C68966) would be installed on 16 February 2021 at the request of Gulf Energy. This would replace the meter located on the outside wall of the community centre and the Clerk was asked to check with the supplier that the replacement meter would be suitable to take account of SOLAR energy production and usage. **ACTION: CLERK**

8 QUARTER 3 (2020/21) ACCOUNTS

- 8.1 The committee received an update on the Q3 accounts, and these had been circulated in advance of the meeting (Appendix 1). Cllr Southgate explained that he, Cllr Wooldridge and Officers had met virtually to review the accounts and it was considered that they were a true reflection of the financial position of the council. It was noted that the Coronavirus pandemic had impacted the hire income which was in the order of £50,000 less than had been budgeted.
- 8.2 The committee agreed to recommend the Q3 accounts to the next meeting of Full Council on the 9 February 2021. **ACTION: CLLR SOUTHGATE**

9 ANNUAL BUDGET (2021/22) AND PRECEPT

- 9.1 The Clerk had circulated budget papers (Appendix 2) to explain the proposed budget figures shown in Appendix 1.
- 9.2 The committee reviewed the figures and discussed options for funding projects in 2021/22. A list of projects produced by Cllr Wooldridge for R&A Committee was taken into account and it was noted that because of the impact of Coronavirus on the 2020/21 budget, the number of projects would be significantly reduced.
- 9.3 A discussion took place about the precept and the example given by the Clerk was presented in the Budget Summary. This would enable projects of £45,000 but to achieve this it would be necessary to use the full allocation of CIL funds (£38,140). It would require an increase in the precept by 11.4% to £174,675. That would be a charge of £40.64 to a Band D property, which would be an additional £3.42 on the current year.
- 9.4 The committee agreed to recommend the 2021/22 budget and precept, as set out above, to Full Council on 9 February 2021. **ACTION: CLLR SOUTHGATE**

10 SOLAR

- 10.1 Cllr Harper circulated a report in advance of the meeting (Appendix 3) setting out the performance of the roof mounted solar panels. It was confirmed that these had generated total savings of £389 between 1 October and 31 December 2020. The committee welcomed the report and thanked Cllr Harper for calculating the savings and for producing the report.
- 11 **CORRESPONDENCE:** There were no items of correspondence.
